VFW Day

I would venture to guess most Veterans at the Post 13 are Veterans of Foreign Wars. I was not real familiar with the qualifications or this designation, until I read the article on the Veteran.com website. I always believed it was a society of WWII, Korean and Vietnam veterans, but that is not the case.

On September 29, 1899, James C. Putnam founded the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

“Military societies started forming in the wake of the Spanish-American War. In 1889 veterans of campaigns in Cuba and the Philippines began organizing based on shared combat experiences.” The American Veterans of Foreign Service, later becoming Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), was one such society. The VFW was the union of The Colorado Society, Army of the Philippines, and the Veterans of Foreign Service in 1913. The purpose of the VFW was to advocate for these Veterans and their rights.

To join, a Veteran must have been honorably discharged from a “foreign war or overseas operation recognized by a campaign medal”. Those include but are not limited to:

- ☆ Service in Korea after June 30, 1949
- ☆ Veterans of World War II, Vietnam, Lebanon, Grenada, Panama
- ☆ Veterans of operations in the Persian Gulf, Somalia, Kosovo
- ☆ Veterans of Afghanistan, Iraq and other smaller expeditionary campaigns
- ☆ Those who have received hostile fire or imminent danger pay

An auxiliary was founded in 1914 to include the following family members of those eligible to join the “main” VFW:

- ☆ Spouses
- ☆ Surviving spouses
- ☆ Parents
- ☆ Grandparents
- ☆ Children
- ☆ Grandchildren
- ☆ Siblings

The VFW are big proponents of the following issues:

- Veteran Health Care
- Disability Assistance
- Memorial Affairs
- Education, Employment and Transition Assistance
- Military Quality of Life

FACTS ABOUT MONOPOLY AND BRITISH POWs DURING WWII

Who hasn't played Monopoly at some point in their life? It's a great game on a rainy day with a house full of people, or after Thanksgiving dinner when everyone is talked out, full, and sitting around looking at each other. But did you know?

"In 1936, the English printing firm Waddingtons produced the very first licensed version of Monopoly — a London-themed edition." It was produced in agreement with Parker Brothers in the United States. Norman Watson, the son of Waddingtons' managing director, agreed to begin producing the game overseas. In 1940, the British intelligence service contacted Waddingtons and asked for mass production of the game to be delivered to Nazi prison camps as aid packages for POWs. But these were no ordinary board games. Each game "contained metal tools to aid in escape efforts, hidden maps provided by the intelligence agency, and real money from Axis nations that could be used to bribe guards."

An Army 2nd lieutenant and U.S. Military Academy graduate was crowned Miss USA, beating out 50 other contestants. Alma Cooper competed in evening gown, swimsuit, and “on-the-spot” interviews. The competition was nationally televised and millions of viewers watched her crowning.

“In April, Cooper became the first active-duty Army officer to compete in and win the Miss Michigan USA competition, according to West Point.

Cooper, 22, graduated with honors in 2023 and majored in math. She’s now working on a master’s degree in statistics at Stanford University as a Knight-Hennessy scholar.” However, Cooper is not the first to be crowned from the armed forces. In January, the Miss America pageant was won by Air Force 2nd Lt. Madison Marsh, who is the first active-duty officer to win that crown. Cooper goes on to compete in the Miss Universe Pageant in Mexico.

The first member of the military to win the Miss USA crown was then-1st Lt. Deshauna Barber, an Army reservist who won in 2016, according to the service.



To be selected for nomination or appointment as a Florida Boys State delegate, the candidate must demonstrate:

- strong academic performance
- excellent Interpersonal skills
- exhibited leadership
- solid Oratorical skills
- be a Junior in a Florida High School
- have at least one semester of high school remaining
- have parents'/guardians' permission to attend
- be certified by the sponsoring AL Post¹

At Boys State, participants learn the rights, privileges and responsibilities of franchised citizens. The training is objective and centers on the structure of city, county, and state governments operated by students elected to various offices. Instruction is also presented on the law and court system, parliamentary procedure, and Florida political History.²

LEON HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT SELECTED TO ATTEND GIRLS NATION

Lenna Gayhart, a Senior at Leon High School, was selected to serve as a Senator to the American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) Girls Nation program held July 20 - 27, 2024, in Washington, DC. Two participants are chosen as Senators from each state after participating in their respective ALA Girls State programs. During ALA Girls Nation, the girls participate in a mock legislature and gain insight into how the federal government works. They are responsible for submitting bills and resolutions, participating in senate sessions, and electing officials, such as president and vice president.

While in DC, the senators visit Capitol Hill and meet with their state senators and representatives, providing each girl an opportunity to discuss local issues and share bills they have written as part of ALA Girls Nation. The girls also participate in field trips to see the historical Washington monuments and memorials, Arlington National Cemetery, and the White House. Some years, the girls have met the President of the United States.

Participants leave ALA Girls Nation with leadership lessons for life and an understanding of the fundamentals of U.S. government, along with the rights, privileges, and responsibilities of citizens. This seven-day experience has laid the foundation of thousands of bright futures in not only public service, but other careers as well. Some notable industries include government, military, law, education, and media.

ALA Girls Nation connects participants with their peers from across the country, allowing the young women a unique opportunity to spend time with others who share common interests and those who have different perspectives from their own. The girls leave Washington, DC with a deeper understanding of government, a renewed sense of patriotism, and an appreciation for veterans.



While at Girls Nation, Senator Gayhart submitted a bill titled, Deceitful Artificial Intelligence Practices Act. This bill was the first one to be passed by the 2024 Girls Nation Senate. Only ten bills passed the Senate during its session. Senator Gayhart was also Federal Housing Director and a member of the Rules and Calendar Committee.

The ALA Girls State and ALA Girls Nation programs are privately funded and presented by members of the American Legion Auxiliary.
